

COVID@Home Monitoring for Primary Care

What is COVID@Home Monitoring for Primary Care?

A community of practice (CoP) supporting primary care providers with clinical pathways based on the best evidence and matching EMR tools for monitoring COVID+ patients in their homes as necessary, providing greater equity of access to care across the province. This initiative includes access to oxygen saturation monitors via centralized procurement through the Ministry of Health for primary care providers to distribute to their higher-risk patients.

What are the benefits for patients, providers and the health system?

- Improved knowledge of clinical pathways for managing COVID+ patients for primary care providers.
- Reduced mortality and morbidity, and improved care experiences for patients.
- Early detection of signs of deterioration, ensuring appropriate cases are expediated to hospital.
- Provision of oxygen (for improved comfort and symptom management) in the home for patients who do not wish to be transferred to hospital (i.e., a palliative approach to care).
